# The ICSID Caseload – Statistics

## Special Focus – Africa

(April 2016)

This issue of the *ICSID Caseload – Statistics (Special Focus – Africa)* provides an overview of the ICSID caseload involving African State Parties. It is based on ICSID cases registered as of April 30, 2016.

This document looks at cases involving an African State as the State Party to the dispute and illustrates the number of cases registered, the type of cases registered, the basis of consent to ICSID jurisdiction invoked in such cases, the economic sectors involved, and the geographic origin and type of investors involved in such cases. It also contains data on outcomes in arbitration proceedings involving an African State Party, including further information on disputes decided by tribunals and on settled or discontinued cases.

This document further looks at cases involving African investors and illustrates the number of cases registered, the type of cases registered, the basis of consent to ICSID jurisdiction invoked in such cases, and the economic sectors concerned in disputes involving African investors. It also contains data on outcomes in ICSID arbitration proceedings involving an African investor, including further information on disputes decided by tribunals and on settled or discontinued cases.

Finally, this document looks at the nationalities and geographic origins of arbitrators, conciliators and *ad hoc* committees members appointed in all ICSID cases, including the number of appointments of African nationals serving as arbitrator, conciliator or *ad hoc* committee member in an ICSID proceeding.

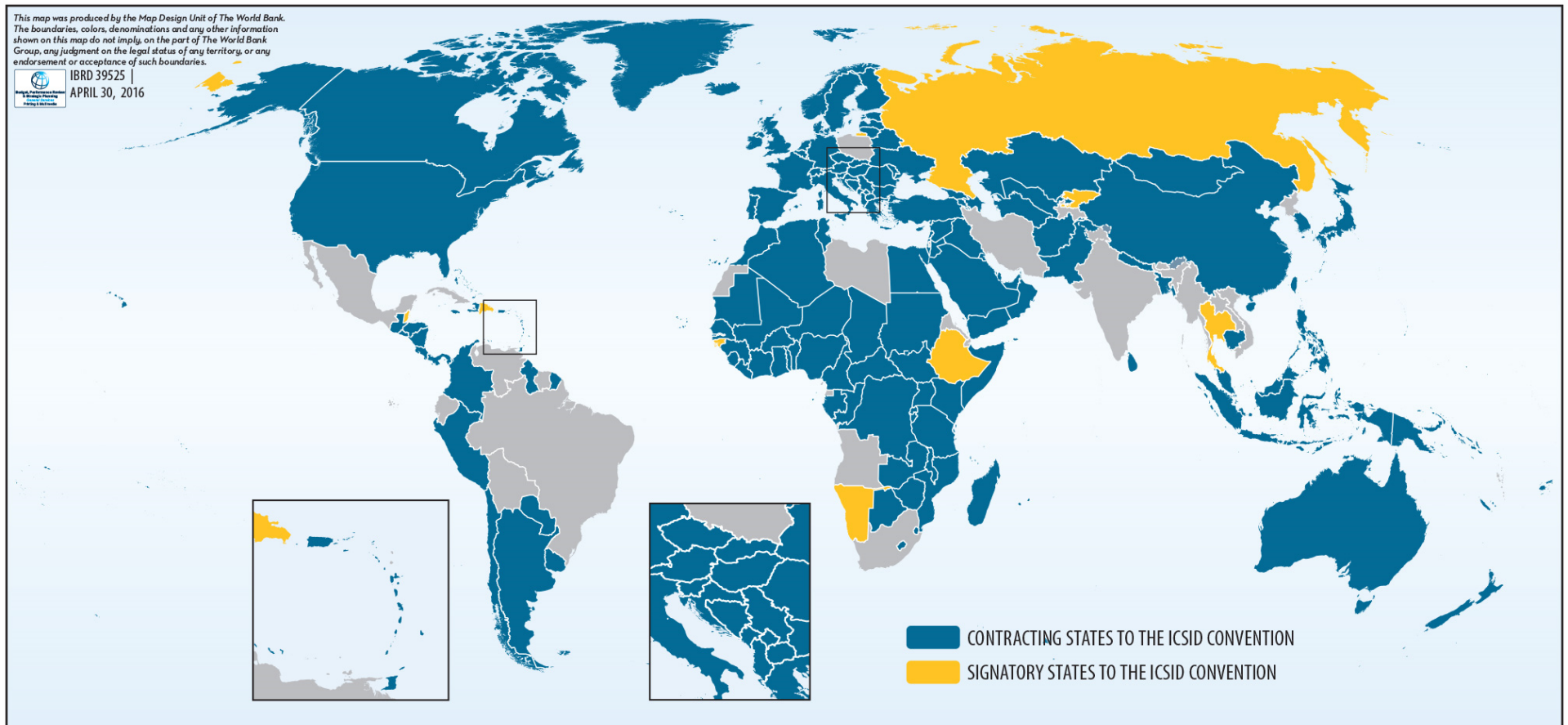

## 1. Map of the ICSID Contracting States and Other Signatories to the ICSID Convention (as of April 30, 2016)

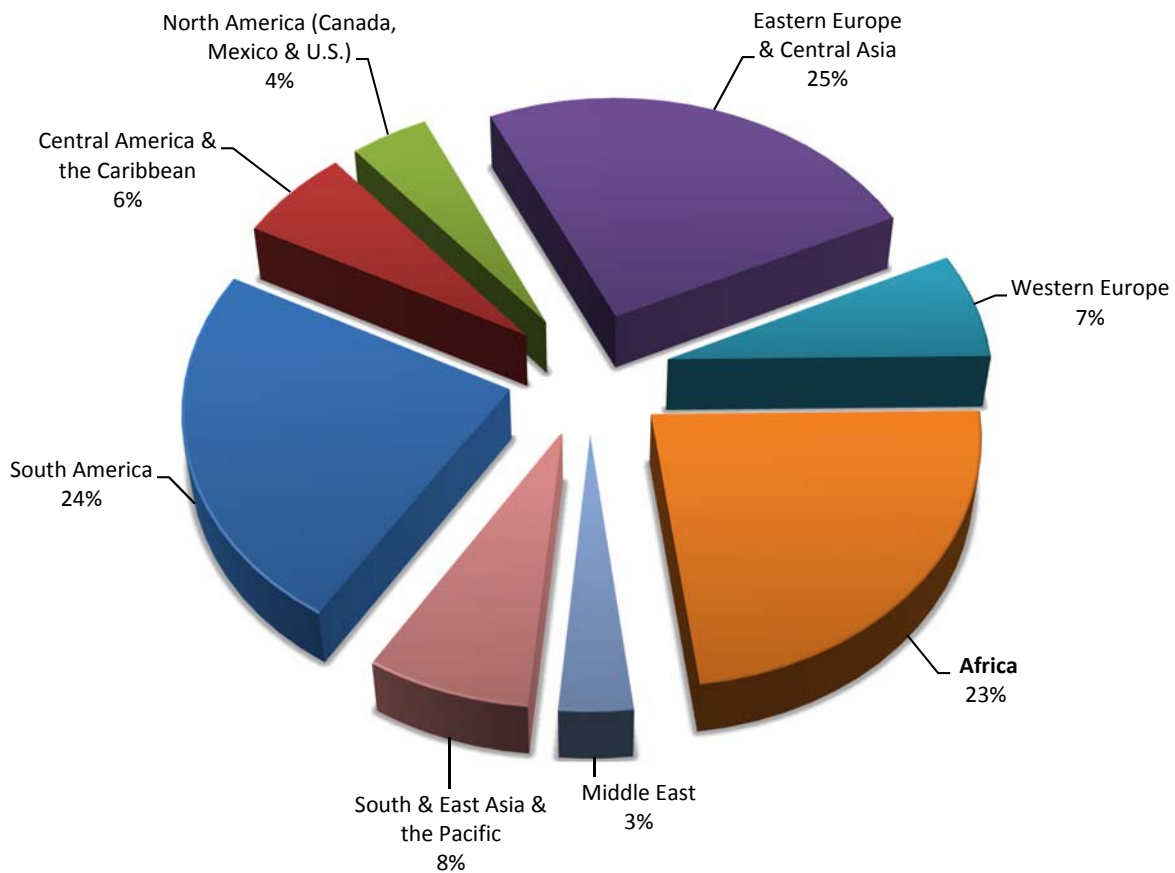




### 3. Geographic Distribution of All ICSID Cases, by State Party Involved

As of April 30, 2016, ICSID had registered 563 cases under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules. One hundred and thirty one (131) of these cases (23%) involved an African State Party. A list of the African States is attached as Annex 1. For a complete list of cases registered by ICSID involving an African State, see Annex 2.

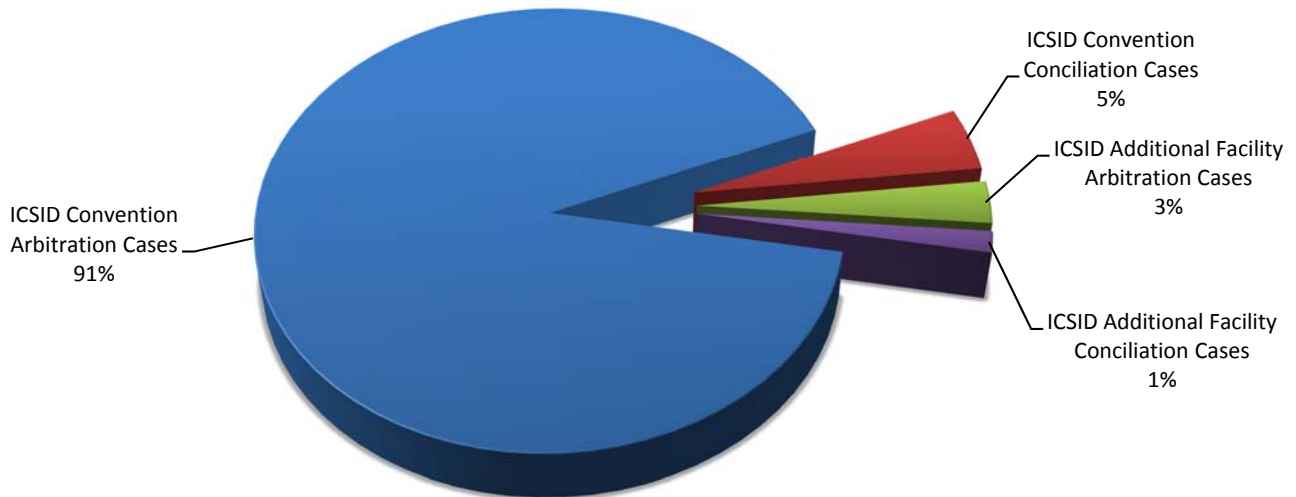

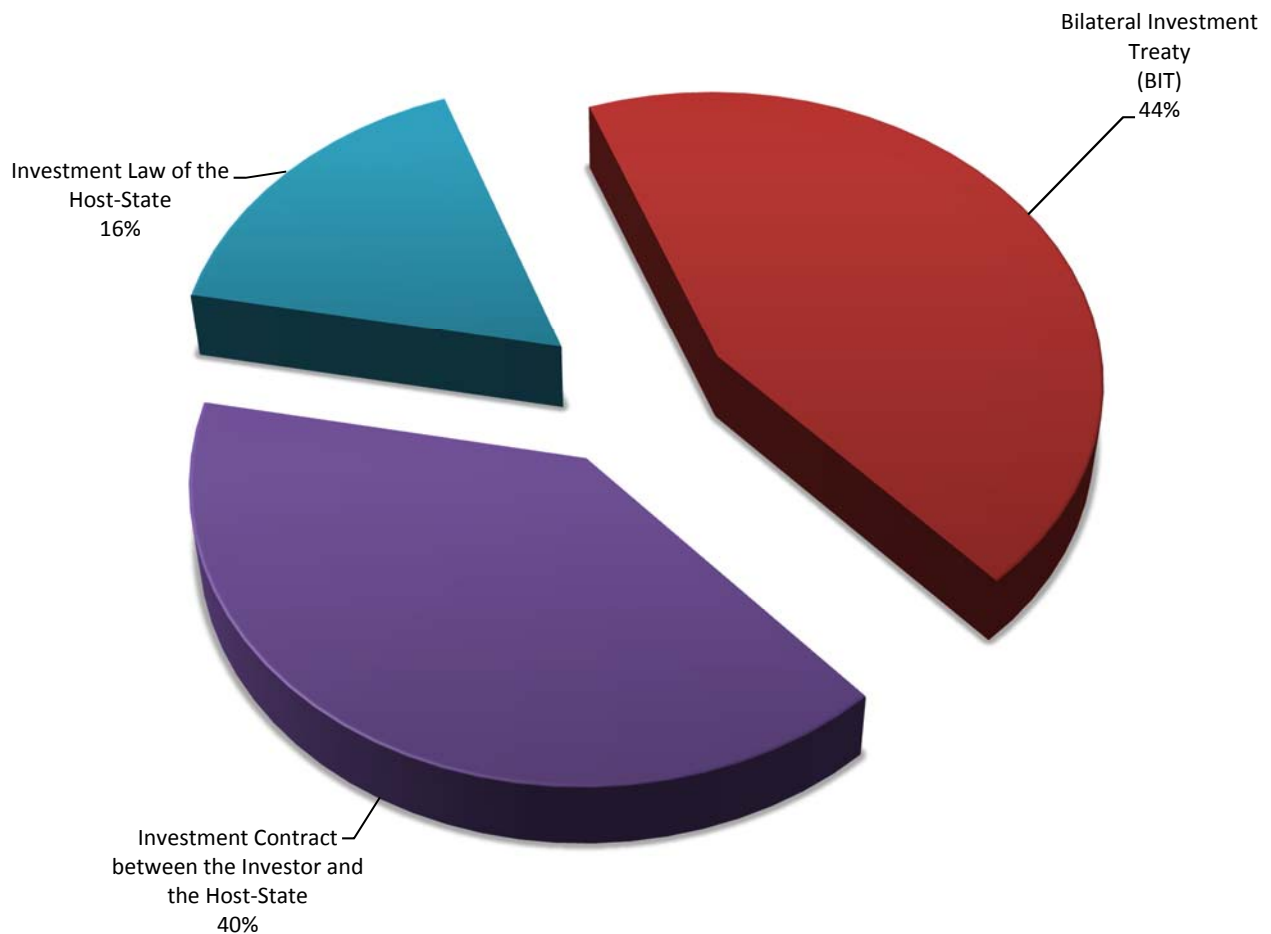
**Chart 3:** Type of Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party:

Of the 131 ICSID cases involving an African State Party, 119 were commenced under the ICSID Convention, and 4 were initiated under the Additional Facility Rules. As of April 30, 2016, 6 conciliation cases were commenced under the ICSID Convention and 2 conciliation cases were initiated under the Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party.



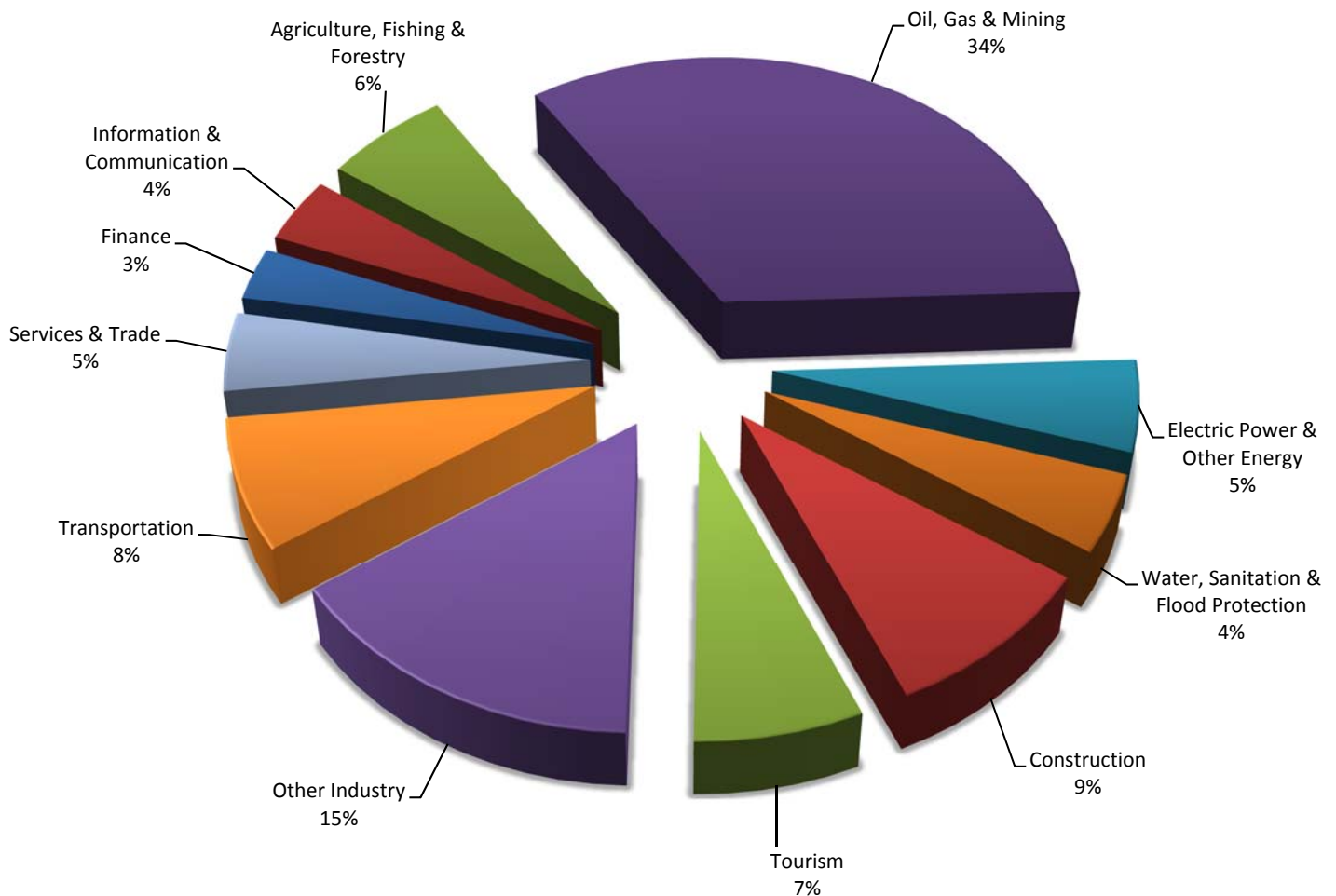
**Chart 4:** Basis of Consent Invoked to Establish ICSID Jurisdiction in Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party:

Of the 131 ICSID cases involving an African State Party, 40% were based on the State’s consent to arbitrate or conciliate in an investment contract between the Investor and the Host-State. Forty-four per cent (44%) of the cases relied on consent found in bilateral investment treaties negotiated by the States, and 16% of cases relied on the investment law of the Host-State.



**Chart 5:** Distribution of Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party, by Economic Sector\*:

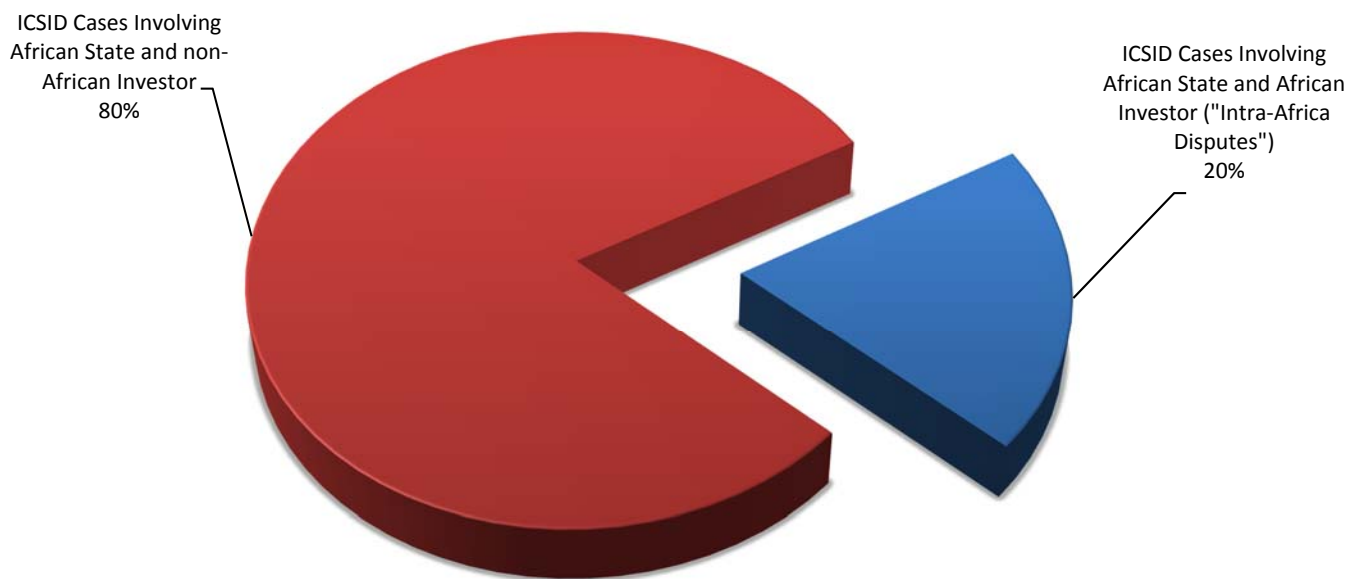
The 131 disputes involving an African State arose in the context of a variety of economic sectors.

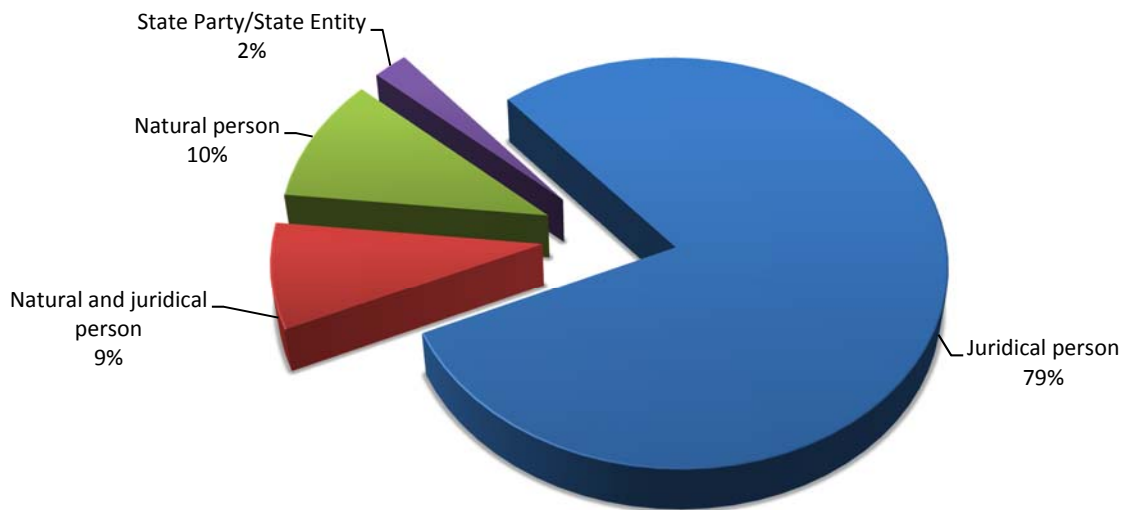
**Chart 6:** Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party – Geographic Origin of Investors:

In the 131 ICSID cases involving an African State Party, 20% were commenced by an African investor (“Intra-Africa Disputes”). The remaining 80% were commenced by investors from States outside Africa.



**Chart 7:** Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party – Type of Investor

Of the 131 ICSID cases involving an African State Party, 19% were instituted by individual persons (“natural persons”). Seventy-nine (79%) involved juridical persons. This term refers to legal entities such as corporations, partnerships, or joint ventures, and includes small and medium sized enterprises, as well as large companies. A further 2% involved cases brought by a State Party or State Entity.



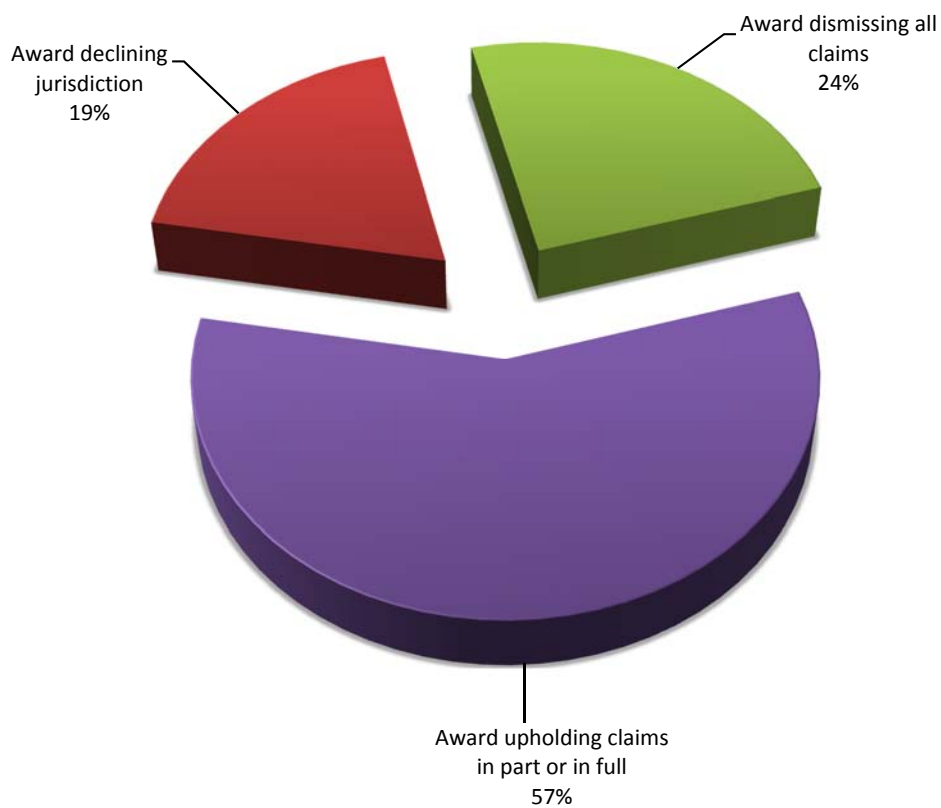
**Chart 8:** Arbitration Proceedings under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party – Outcomes:

In the arbitrations involving an African State Party that have concluded, 41% were settled by the parties or discontinued before a final determination of the tribunal. The basis for settlement or discontinuance is indicated in Chart 8b.

The other 59% were resolved by a final award by the tribunal. Where the tribunal rendered a final award, 19% of the awards declined jurisdiction, 24% dismissed all claims, and 57% upheld the claims in part or in full (see Chart 8a).

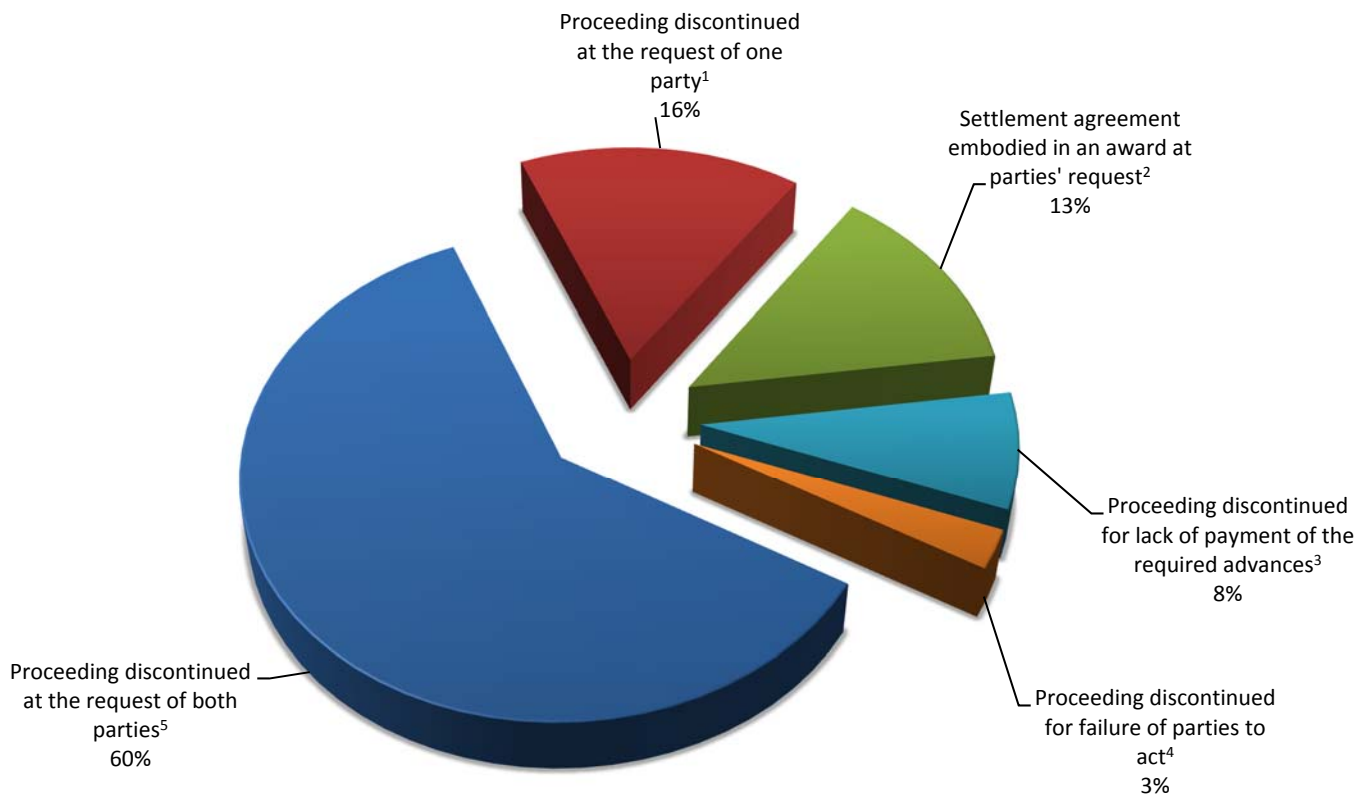


**Chart 8a:** Disputes Decided by Arbitral Tribunals under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party – Findings:

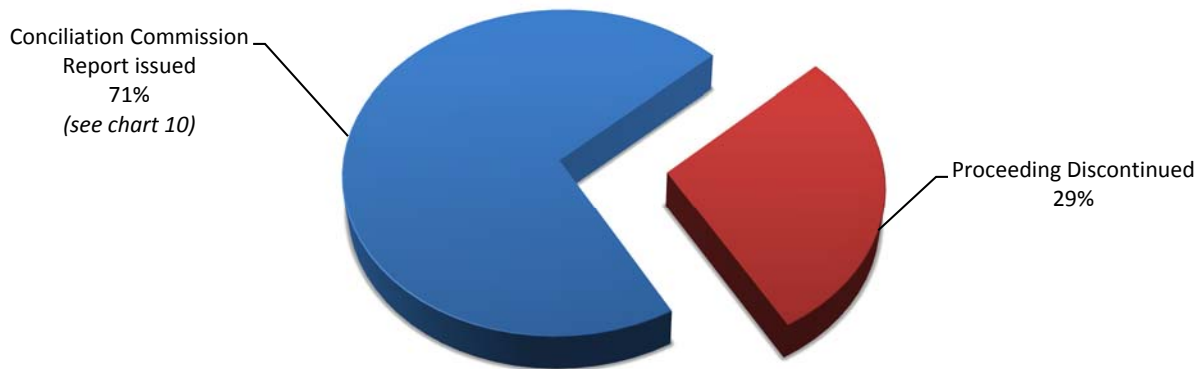

**Chart 9:** Conciliation Proceedings under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party – Outcomes:



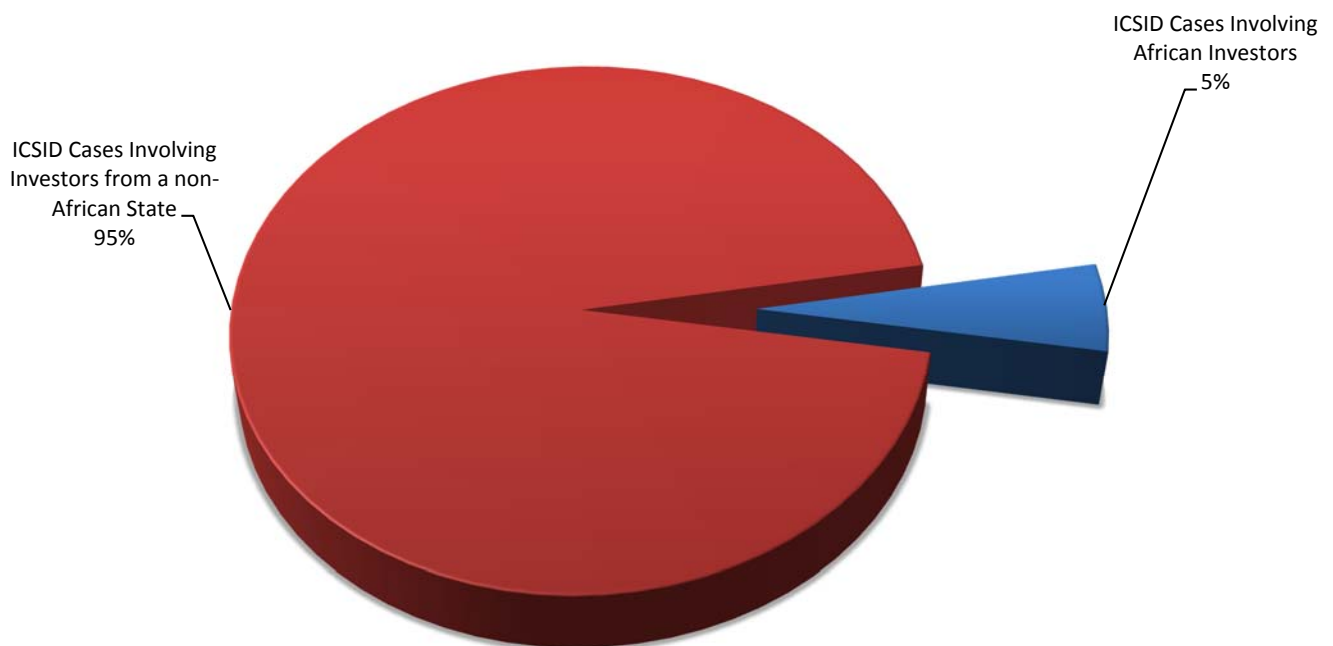
**Chart 10:** Conciliation Proceedings under ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving an African State Party – Commission Reports:



## 5. ICSID Cases involving African Investors – Details

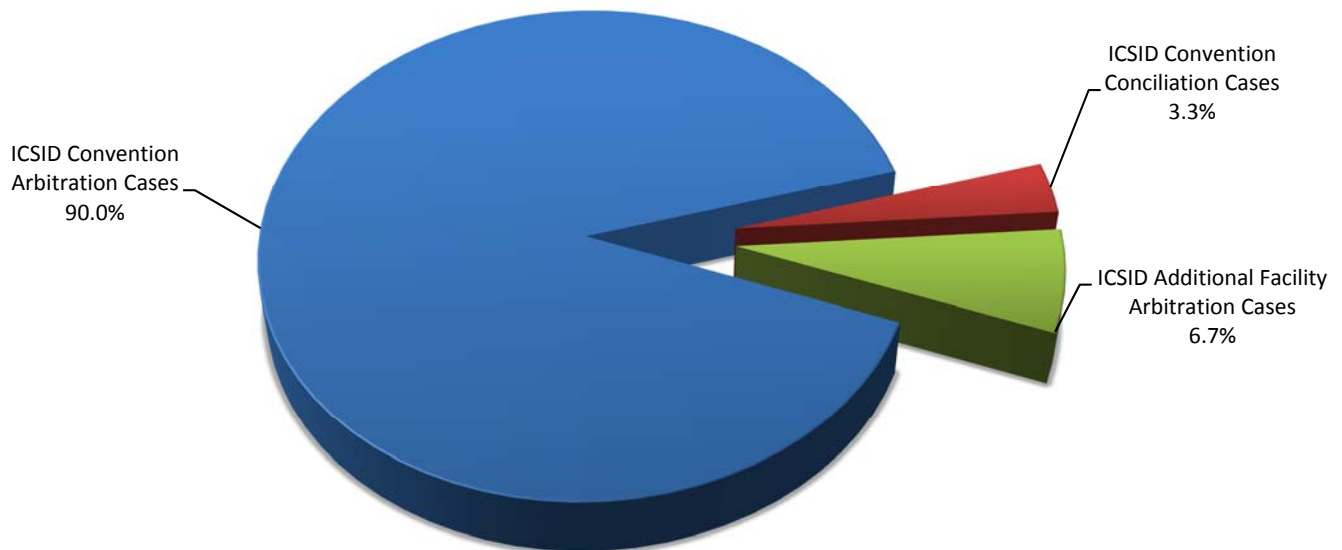
**Chart 11:** All Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules – Geographic Origin of Investor:

Investors of African origin were involved in 5% of registered ICSID cases. The data is based on the nationality of Investors as reported at the time of registration.



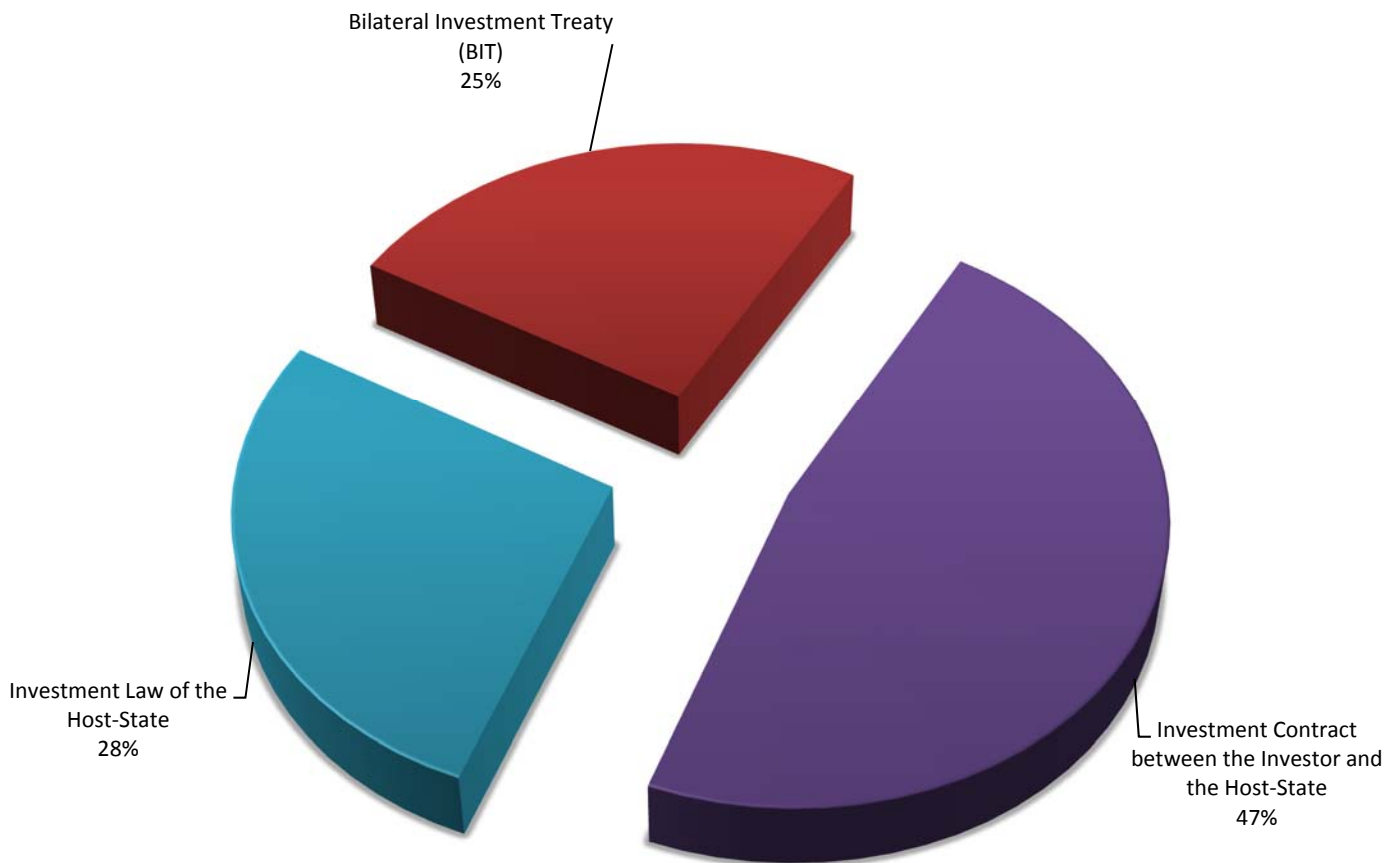
**Chart 12:** Type of Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving African Investors:

Investors of African origin relied primarily on the arbitration mechanism established by the ICSID Convention (90%), and the Additional Facility Rules (6.7%). In addition, 3.3% of the cases involving an African investor were conciliation proceedings under the ICSID Convention.



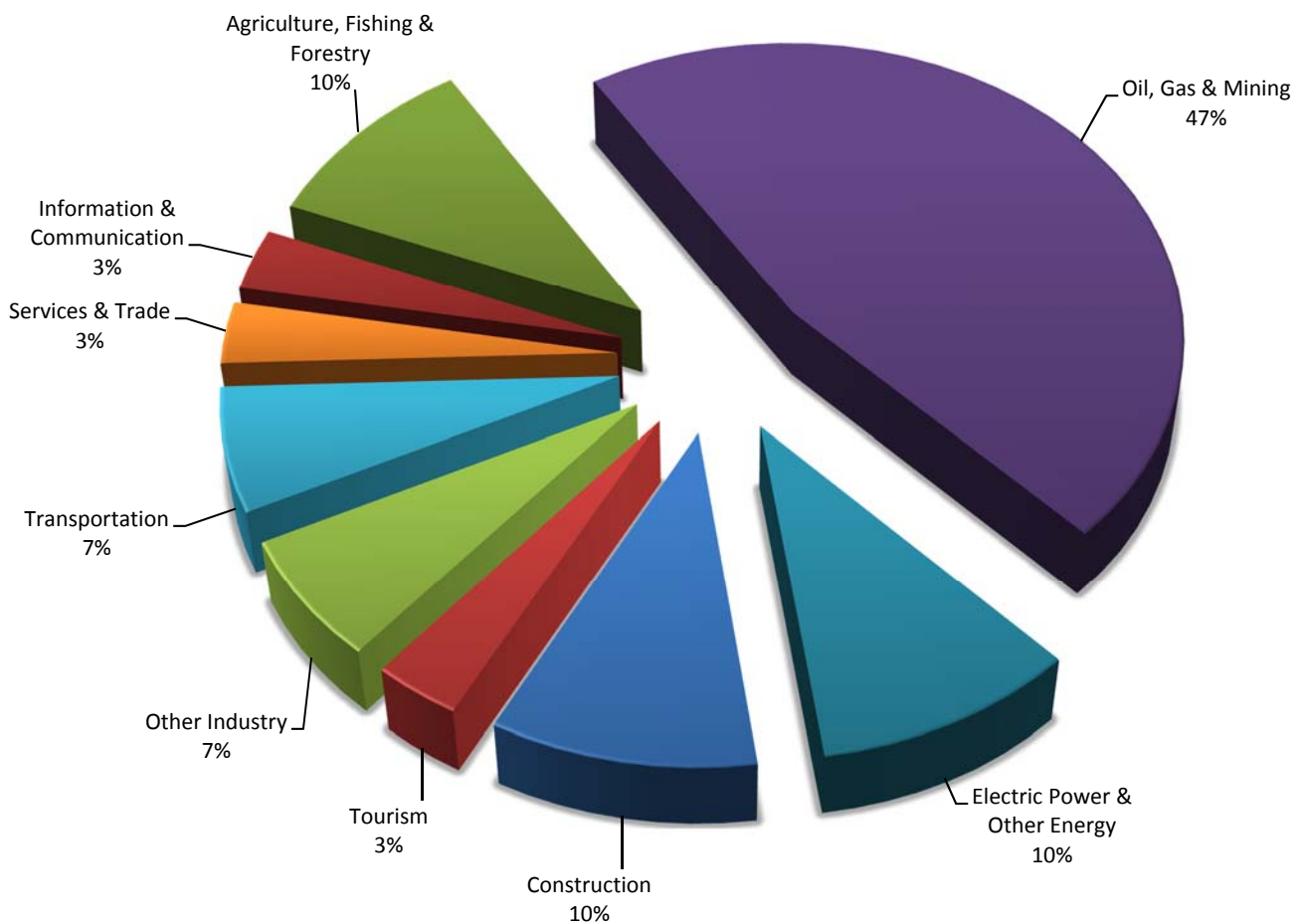
**Chart 13:** Basis of Consent Invoked to Establish ICSID Jurisdiction in Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving African Investors:

Of the ICSID cases involving an African investor, 25% were based on the State’s consent to arbitrate or conciliate in bilateral investment treaties negotiated by the State. Forty-seven percent (47%) relied on an ICSID dispute settlement provision in an investment contract between the investor and the Host-State. The remaining cases invoked the State’s consent to ICSID jurisdiction found in the investment law of the Host-State (28%).

The disputes involving an African investor concerned a variety of economic sectors.

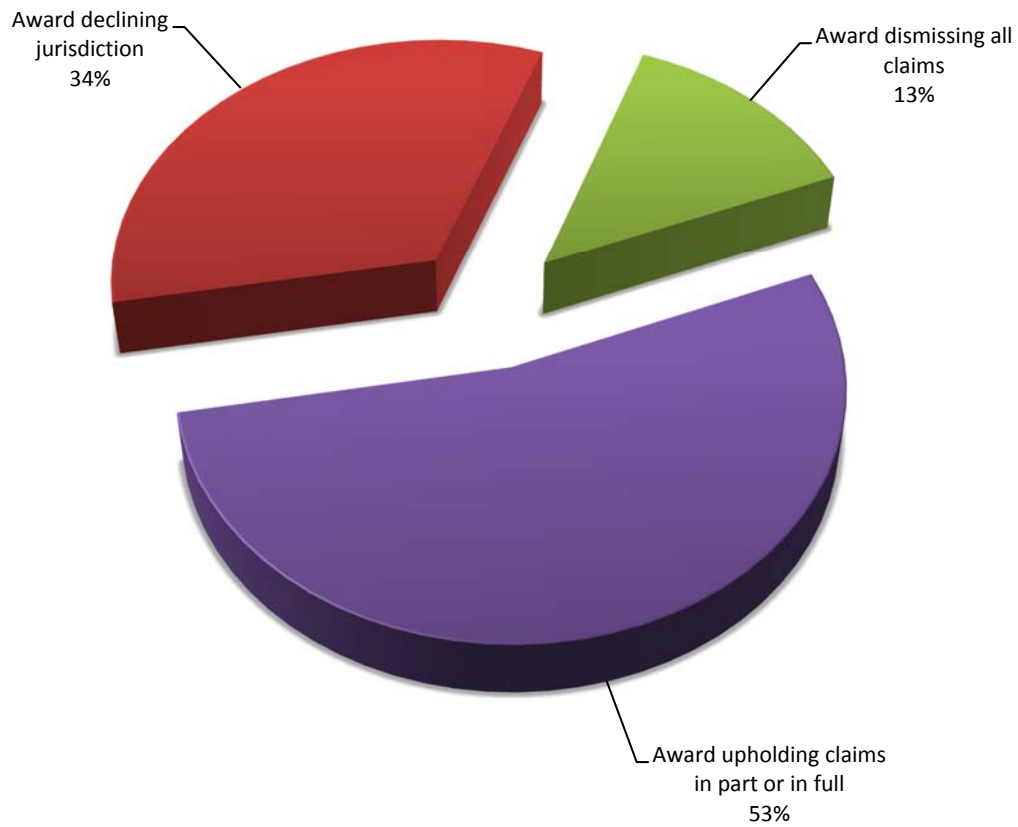
**Chart 15:** Arbitration Proceedings under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving African Investors – Outcomes:

In the ICSID arbitrations involving an African investor that have been concluded, 32% were settled by the parties or discontinued before a final determination of the tribunal. The basis for settlement or discontinuance is indicated in Chart 15b.

The other 68% were resolved in a final award by the tribunal. Where the tribunal rendered a final award, 34% of the awards declined jurisdiction, 13% dismissed all claims, and 53% upheld the claims in part or in full (see Chart 15a).

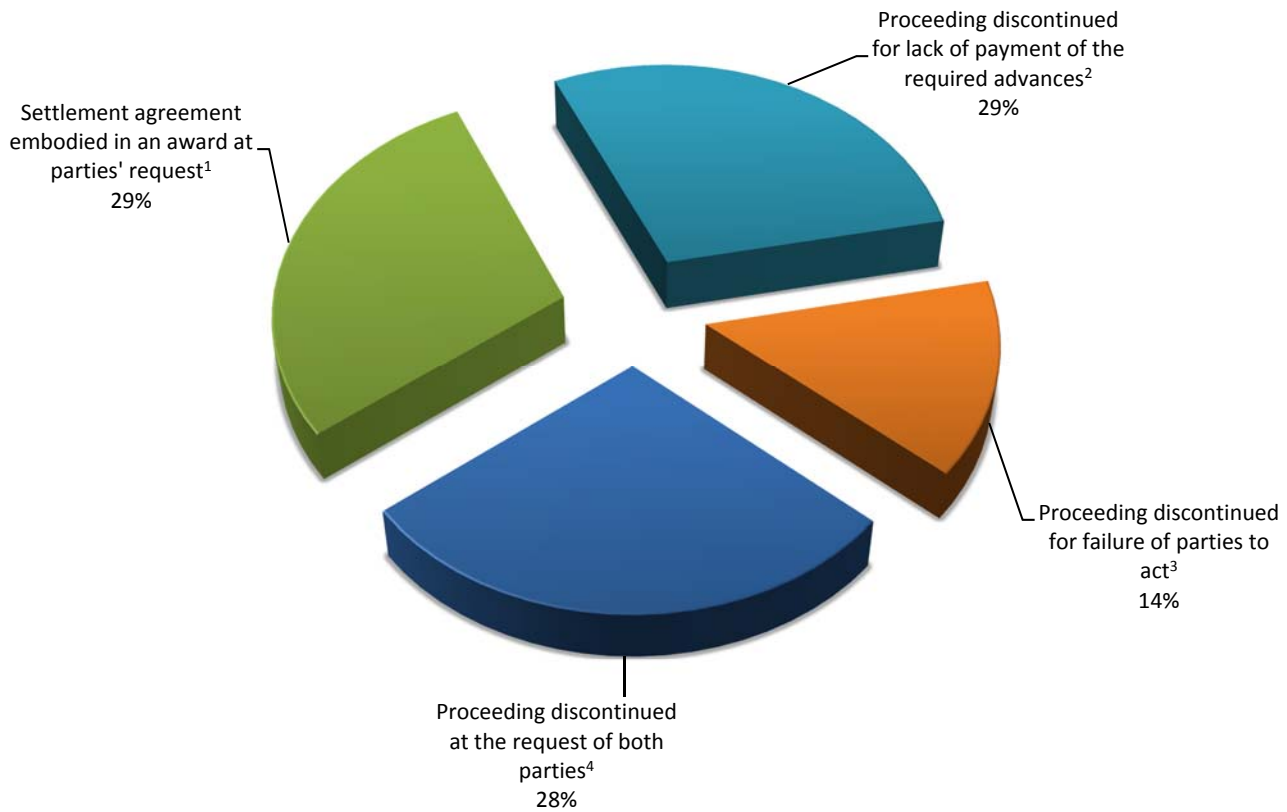


**Chart 15a:** Disputes Decided by Arbitral Tribunals under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules involving African Investors – Findings:

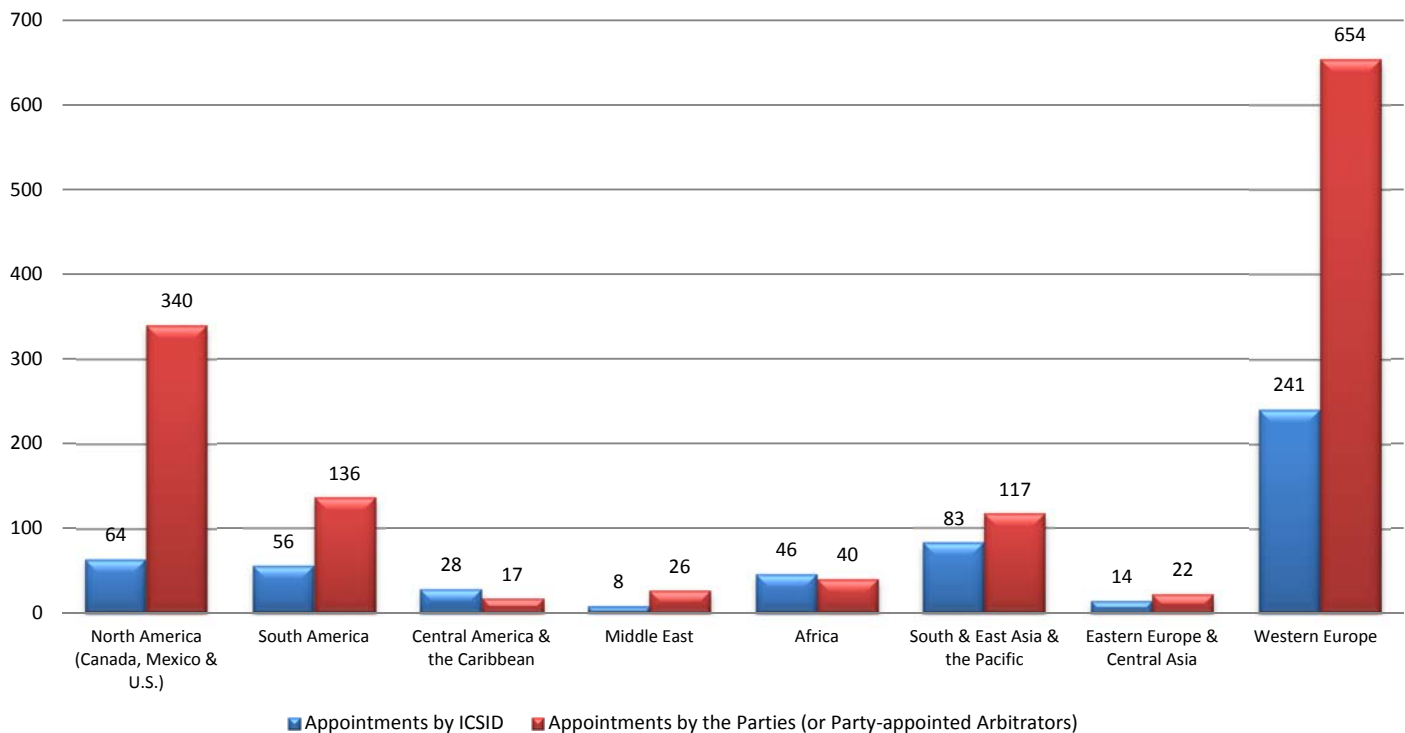

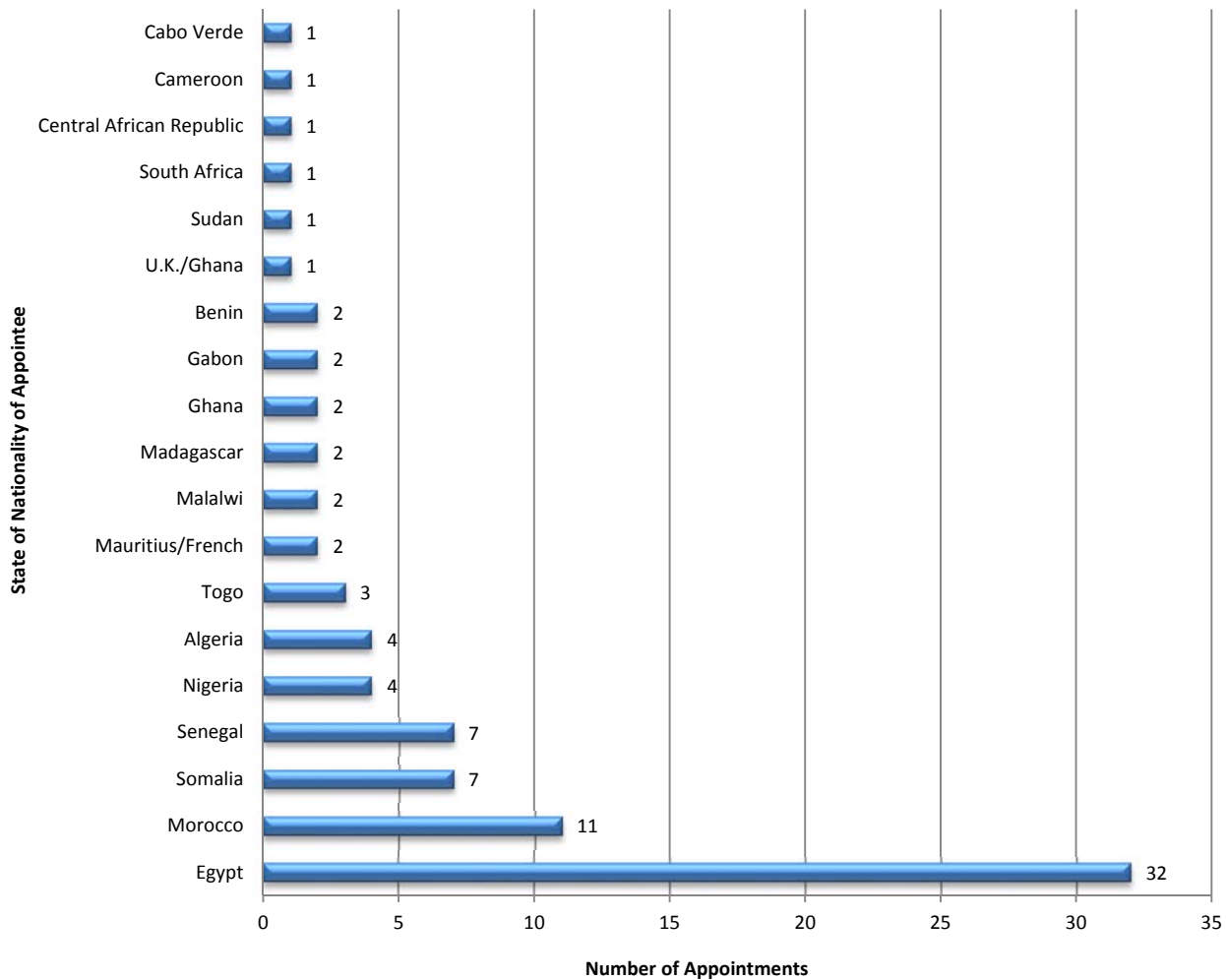
In approximately 72% of the appointments made in ICSID cases, the parties select the appointees (indicated in red, below). A number of such appointees are nationals of an Africa State. The remaining 28% of appointments are made by ICSID (indicated in blue, below).

**Chart 17:** State of Nationality of Arbitrators, Conciliators and *ad hoc* Committee Members from African States Appointed in Cases Registered under the ICSID Convention and Additional Facility Rules:

A number of African nationals served as arbitrators, conciliators or *ad hoc* Committee members in ICSID cases. In total, about 5% of all appointments made in ICSID cases involved nationals from an African State.
